

Grading

- The class grade a student earns at Mundelein High School, should accurately represent what students know and are able to do. A minimum of 80% of the students' grade will be based on summative assessments and a maximum of 20% of the grade will be determined by formative assessment.
- Formative evidence (practice) such as
 - o Homework and in-class work, etc.
 - Students will get feedback along the way
- Summative assessment (tests, projects, presentations)
 - Summary of what students know and can do

Reassessment


- We believe that students learn at different rates. Mastery of learning targets comes at different times.
- Reassessments are available for all summative assessment
 - Students will need to show some evidence of learning before taking reassessment.
- Our message to students:
 - You must learn what is being taught. We want to provide opportunities for you to show us your new learning.




- *If you are dropping off ARRIVE EARLY



School Safety

Director of Security

34 Years in law enforcement both with the Mundelein Police Department and with the Lake County Sheriff's Department including SRO. Retired from the Mundelein Police Department as a Commander in 2017. I maintain a constant line of communication with the MPD so as to share security/law enforcement information. The MPD utilizes MHS to conduct their tactical training and to familiarize all their officers with the layout of the school. MHS does have a full time School Resource Officer. MHS does have full time security personnel who receive ongoing training in first aid, CPR, and other security related issues. We are part of the ALICE program which teaches staff and students on lockdown, evacuate, counter, and swarm procedures. We conduct annual safety drills including a law enforcement drill, school evacuation drills, bus evacuation drills, and severe weather/shelter in place drills.
