

Black History Month



Boys Bowling Coaches Corner


Varsity boys bowling competed at state this past weekend. The team didn't finish where they wanted but had a great season. Congratulations Mustangs.







- Clothing that depicts pornography, nudity or sexual acts is prohibited.


Attendance

Regular school attendance is required and necessary to develop the academic and intrapersonal skills needed for success. Students are expected to attend each class and be on time. Students who attend school regularly have been shown to achieve at higher levels than students who do not have regular attendance. If your student is

What is Good Attendance?

Our MHS Attendance Committee felt it was important to create a simple and clear visual that students and families can reference to understand our expectations surrounding what good attendance looks like.



Missing only one day each month is the same as missing 9 days in a school year = **Chronic absences**

When a student has chronic absences, it is difficult to catchup

Valid Excuses for Absences:

- Illness (including mental health)
- Observance of a religious holiday
- Death in the immediate family
- Family emergency
- Other approved situations
