





### **Student Recognition**

Several MHS students placed in the top 10 finishers at the Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA)'s 2023 State Leadership Conference on April 14-15 in Springfield.

The top finishers included: 2nd place winner and nationals qualifier Kurt Dumblauskas (Business Communication); 5th place winners Animesh Bijawat and Devin Boongaling (Digital Video Production; 5th place winner Xander Ede (Website Design); 6th place winner Azael Sanchez (Economics); 7th place winner Thomas Russ (Personal Finance); eighth place winner Charlotte Oliver (Advertising); and 9th place winner Jared Reyes (Supply Chain Management).




### **Social Emotional Learning Day**



### **Boys Volleyball Coaches Corner**

Our Varsity volleyball team went 3 - 2 at the Lake County Invite this past weekend defeating Deerfield, Grant, and Lake Forest to win the Bronze Division. At the Barrington Tournament, the JV team went 3-2 defeating Lake Zurich, Hinsdale South, and Lake Park taking 5th. The Frosh/Soph team took 2nd at the Libertyville Invite going 4-1, with their only loss going to Libertyville in the title game. On Monday night JV & Frosh/Soph teams defeated Antioch. While the Varsity defeated Rockford Jefferson in 3 sets. Then they lost to Antioch 23-25, 24-26 in an amazing match. There has been a lot of exciting volleyball happening this past week! All levels are at Home on Monday when they take on Grayslake North, and again at Home on Wednesday against Warren.

### **Boys Track Coaches Corner**

Last Thursday- Boys win the team title at Lane Tech for the first time ever, against some very strong competition. Lots and lots of great performances, starting with the 4 x 100 relay, who took a very close 2nd (.02 seconds) to a very good Plainfield North. Marcel Siepko comes back to win the 200m with his best time of the season, 22.73. Saturday at Springfield, the Varsity 4 x 100 got it done, taking 2nd in 44.31, with the foursome of Reece Cruz, Julian Eagar, Nick Selimos and Marcel Siepko. The F/S 4 x 800 of Javy Mata, Logan Ramirez, Alberto Diaz, and freshman Kessler Magrow ran 8:36, taking 2nd and dropping 20 seconds from our previous best this season. Tyler Miller 5th in the 110 HH. Ben Segura breaks 20 for the first time in the same event. Brandon Hansen took 2nd in the Varsity Shot, with William Villchynskyy taking 4th in the F/S discus. The F/S 4 x 4000 relay took 5th, and Marcel Siepko took 3rd in the 200. Overall- last year we scored 8 points at the F/S level, and only 1 at the Varsity. This year we scored 14 at the F/S level, and 30 at the Varsity. Pretty nice improvement in one year......

This Friday, the Varsity crew compete in the Round Lake Blue Thunder Co-Ed Invite, and Saturday, we host our Annual Middle Schools Invitation, the Keith Zawila Invite.



### **Dress Code**

- Clothing that depicts pornography, nudity or sexual acts is prohibited.

Regular school attendance is required and necessary to develop the academic and intrapersonal skills needed for success. Students are expected to attend each class and be on time. Students who attend school regularly have been shown to achieve at higher levels than students who do not have regular attendance. Missing only one day each month is the same as missing 9 days in a school year = Chronic absences

When a student has chronic absences, it is difficult to catchup

### **Valid Excuses for Absences:**

- Illness (including mental health)
- · Observance of a religious holiday
- Death in the immediate family
- Family emergency
- Other approved situations
