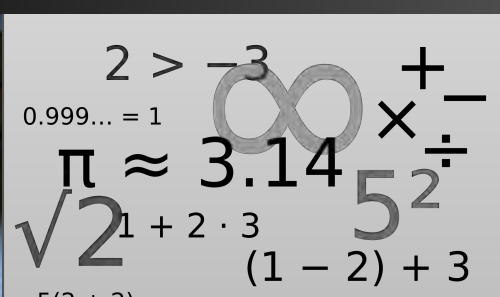


- Review middle school test score data: MAP or STAR

- Determine math placement by the student's eighth grade math course
- Assign support classes (Academic Support Reading, Academic Support Math, or Guided Study)

# Earned Honors

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- Students can earn honors credit in English 1, Biology, and World Studies.
- In order to earn honors in these three classes, students will need to demonstrate honors level achievement on the course assessments
- Earned honors is only for these freshmen courses. Beginning sophomore year, we offer separate advanced level courses: Honors English 2, Honors Chemistry, and Advanced Placement U.S. History
- Freshmen can choose to take Advanced Placement Human Geography as an advanced level elective course.

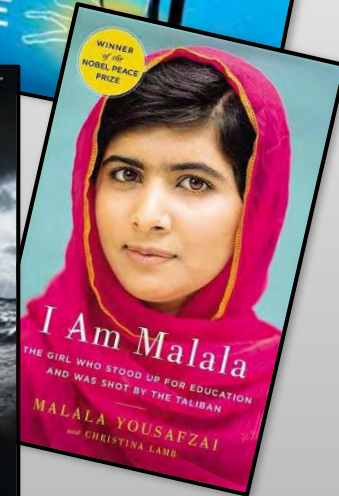


## Earned Honors English 1

# World Languages

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**Spanish or French 1** → No background in either language

**Spanish 2** → Took Spanish in middle school

**Honors Spanish for Heritage Learners 2** → Can speak Spanish, but cannot read or write in the language

**Honors Spanish for Heritage Learners 3** → Fluent in Spanish and can read and write in the language

**Honors Spanish 3** → Native English speakers who have been in dual language programs in elementary and middle school

# Support Courses

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**Academic Support Reading:** Students will receive support in reading instruction, executive functioning, and their other academic classes.

**Academic Support Math:** Students will enhance their foundational math skills instruction and receive support in Geometry Seminar or Algebra 1. This class is highly recommended but not required.

**Guided Study:** Students will receive intentional support in managing their academic workload and have time within their school day to complete their class work with the assistance of a teacher.
