About the band

Mundelein High School Wind Ensemble

The Mundelein High School Wind Ensemble is the top level concert band in the school's program. Membership is open to all 9th through 12th grade students by audition. The Wind Ensemble gives 8-10 public performances during a typical school year and is designated as an honors level course in the Mundelein High School curriculum. In 2017, the Wind Ensemble premiered two new works by Dana Wilson (*On Fire! [Wild Ride on a Fire Engine]* and *The Banquet... and the poison soup plot*) which were commissioned by a consortium led by the Mundelein High School Bands. The band has been selected to perform at the University of Illinois Bands SuperState Festival on several occasions, and has earned numerous Superior ratings at the Chicagoland Invitational Concert Band Festival.

Mundelein High School Concert Bands

Mundelein High School offers four concert bands, which are the core of our band program. Students continue to develop the fundamental skills of instrumental performance through participation in these groups. Each concert band meets during one period of the school day during both fall and spring semesters. Enrollment in a concert band class is a prerequisite for participation in most other band program activities.

Mundelein High School Jazz Bands

Mundelein High School offers two jazz bands which are an important component of the MHS band program. Each jazz band rehearses for one class period and participates in concerts at the school and around the local community including the Mundelein Invitational, hosted annually by MHS Bands. Students must be enrolled in a concert band in order to enroll in a jazz band.

Marching Mustangs

Marching Mustangs provide an opportunity for all MHS band students to perform together as one ensemble. The Marching Mustangs perform at each home football game as well as at two festivals each year.



AP courses

Over 53% of band students enrolled in at least one AP course. Collectively, 257 AP course enrollments are



Approximately 50% of band students participate in a sport and are represented in all seasons (fall, winter, spring). 65% of band students participate in a club.



The simple GPA for MHS band students is 3.48. (MHS average is 3.02)

Directors' Biographies



Jerry Shelato is in his twenty-seventh year as a music teacher and in his ninth year on the faculty at Mundelein High School. At Mundelein High School, he teaches the Honors Wind Ensemble and Symphonic Band as well as the Jazz Orchestra and Intermediate Guitar classes. He also directs the Spring Musical pit orchestra and co-directs the Marching Mustangs and the Mundelein High School Pep Band. Mr. Shelato has previously taught in the Champaign and Urbana school districts and has taught conducting and music education methods during his years of graduate study. He holds Bachelor's and Master's Degrees in Music Education from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, where he has also completed Doctoral coursework in Music Education. There, he studied tuba with Mark Moore and

conducting with Thomas Wisniewski and James Keene, and performed in the Wind Symphony, in the British Brass Band, and in Jazz Band I. Mr. Shelato has received several Citations of Excellence from the National Band Association.

Andy Sturgeon is in his fifteenth year as a band director and ninth year at Mundelein High School. At Mundelein High School he teaches the Honors Symphonic Winds and Freshmen Concert Band as well as the Honors Jazz Ensemble and a Beginning Guitar class. He also directs the Noise Show Choir Combo and co-directs the Marching Mustangs and the Mundelein High School Pep Band. Before coming to Mundelein High School, Mr. Sturgeon was the Director of Bands in Evergreen Park School District 124 where he taught 5th through 8th grade instrumental music students. He holds a Bachelor's Degree in Music Education from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign and a Master's Degree in Educational Leadership from Concordia University. Mr. Sturgeon is an active trombone player and played with the Northshore Concert Band for nine years.

Program Notes

A Mother of a Revolution!

Omar Thomas

Born to Guyanese parents in Brooklyn, New York in 1984, Omar Thomas moved to Boston in 2006 to pursue a Master of Music in Jazz Composition at the New England Conservatory of Music after studying Music Education at James Madison University in Harrisonburg, Virginia. He is the protégé of lauded composers and educators Ken Schaphorst and Frank Carlberg, and has studied under multiple Grammy-winning composer and bandleader Maria Schneider.

During his master's studies, Thomas was appointed to the position of Assistant Professor of Harmony at the Berklee College of Music at the age of 23. He was awarded the ASCAP Young Jazz Composers Award in 2008, and invited by the ASCAP Association to perform his music in their highly exclusive JaZzCap Showcase, held in New York City. In 2012, Thomas was named the Boston Music Award's "Jazz Artist of the Year." Following his Berklee tenure, he served on faculty of the Music Theory department at The Peabody Institute of The Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore. Now a Yamaha Master Educator, he is currently an Assistant Professor of Composition and Jazz Studies at The University of Texas at Austin.

From the score:

This piece is a celebration of the bravery of trans women, and in particular Marsha "Pay It No Mind" Johnson. Marsha is credited with being one of the instigators of the famous Stonewall uprising of June 28, 1969 -- one of the pivotal events of the LCBTQ liberation movement of the 20th century -- which is commemorated annually during the worldwide Cay Pride celebrations. Existing as a trans woman, especially a trans woman of color, and daring to live authentically, creating space for oneself in a transphobic world, is one of the bravest acts I can imagine. Over 20 trans women were murdered in the United States in 2018 alone. There is no demographic more deserving and, frankly, long overdue for highlighted heroism and bravery. The disco vibe in the latter half of the piece is meant to honor club culture, a sacred space held amongst LCBTQ persons in which to love, live, mourn, heal, strategize, connect, disconnect, and dance in defiance of those outside forces who would seek to do LCBTQ persons harm simply for daring to exist and take up space.

Roma

Valerie Coleman

Valerie Coleman was born in Louisville, Kentucky in 1970. Having begun formal musical studies at age 11 and having composed three complete symphonies by the age of 14, Coleman earned degrees in both composition/theory and flute performance at Boston University. She then completed a master's degree in flute performance at the Mannes College of Music, where she also founded the GRAMMY-nominated Imani Winds. She has served on the faculty at the Frost School of Music at the University of Miami, and is currently the Clara Mannes Fellow for Music Leadership at the Mannes School of Music, where she is a member of the Flute and Composition faculties.

She is a recipient of numerous awards, including the MAPFund, ASCAP Honors Award, and the Herb Alpert Ragdale Residency Award. Her

Umoja, Anthem of Unity was named one of the "Top 101 Great American Ensemble Works" by Chamber Music America and is widely performed as a staple of modern woodwind quintet repertoire.

From the score:

A nation without a country is the best way to describe the nomadic tribes known as gypsies, or properly called, the Romani. Their traditions, their language (Roma), legends, and music stretch all over the globe. from the Middle East, the Mediterranean region, and the Iberian peninsula, across the ocean to the Americas.

"Roma" is a tribute to that culture, in five descriptive themes, as told through the eyes and hearts of Romani women everywhere: "Romani Women," "Mystic", "Youth," "Trickster," and "History." The melodies and rhythms are a fusion of styles and cultures: malagueña of Spain, Argentine tango, Arabic music, Turkish folk songs, 3/2 Latin claves, and jazz.

"Polka and Fugue"

from *Schwanda the Bagpiper*Jaromir Weinberger; transcribed by Glenn Cliffe Bainum

Czech-American composer Jaromir Weinberger (1896-1967) was born in Prague, but spent much of his boyhood on his grandparents' farm. It was here that he absorbed the folk songs and dances of his native land - music that would serve as the blueprint of his most successful compositional output. Stints as a pianist, an operatic director, and a conservatory director eventually gave way to a career as a full time composer as his compositional opportunities and responsibilities increased. Fleeing Nazi persecution in Czechoslovakia in 1939, he eventually became an American citizen and settled in St. Petersburg, Florida.

Following a lukewarm premiere in Prague in 1927, Schwanda the Bagpiper became a sensation upon its revival in German (Schwanda, der Dudelsackpfeifer) in late 1928.

The libretto involves a story of Schwanda, the master bagpiper, and Babinsky, a robber who leads Schwanda on a series of adventures. The Polka is taken from a scene in which Schwanda's piping melts the heart of Queen Iceheart, which leads to a kiss that seals their marriage vow. The marriage cannot be, however, as Schwanda is already married to Dorota. Responding to Dorota's interrogation regarding his fidelity, he cries, "If I have given the queen a single kiss, may the devil take me" -- and the devil does. But Babinsky then plays cards with the devil and wins all his possessions, which he trades to save Schwanda. Schwanda plays the fugue on his bagpipe before returning, allowing the servants of hell to hear the playing of a master bagpiper.
