SCHOLARSHIPS OPENING in FALL

August

- Pinnacle Peak Recovery Scholarship: All applicants for this scholarship must submit a 500-1,000 word essay in English explaining what they're doing or what they will do to combat substance abuse and addiction. The essay must be grammatically correct and 100% original. Students must be planning to attend a 2 or 4 year college or university. Students must be 18 years old at the time they apply for the scholarship.
- Daughters of the American Revolution Scholarships: The NSDAR awards multiple scholarships to students showing dedication to the pursuit of degrees in diverse disciplines including history, law, nursing, and education. The DAR Scholarship Committee awards scholarships to qualified applicants regardless of race, religion or sex. All applicants must be United States citizens. All multi-year scholarships, typically renewable up to four years, must be for consecutive years of attendance at an accredited college or university in the United States. The only exception is the American Indian Scholarship that is available for students pursuing vocational training. Application deadlines vary.
- Temple Hoyne Buell Memorial Scholarship: Three \$1,000 scholarships are being offered to qualified incoming freshman men who will be attending the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign beginning Fall 2023. Recipients will be those applicants who best exemplify the ideals of Chi Psi Fraternity intellectually, morally, and socially. Semifinalists will be required to attend an interview on a day and time to be announced. Each finalist will then be interviewed during the first week of school at the Chi Psi Lodge in Urbana.
- Chick Evans Scholarship for Caddies: Applicants for this scholarship must have a strong
 caddie record, excellent academics, demonstrated financial need, and outstanding
 character. Most Scholars attend one of the 14 universities where the Foundation operates a
 Scholarship House. This scholarship provides full tuition and housing.
- Horatio Alger Scholarship Programs: As one of the nation's largest need-based college scholarship programs in the country, the Horatio Alger Scholarship Programs specifically assist high school students who have faced and overcome great obstacles in their young lives. While many programs are directed primarily to recognizing academic achievement or leadership potential, the Horatio Alger Association seeks students who have exhibited determination, integrity, and perseverance in overcoming adversity, as well as have critical financial need. The Horatio Alger Scholarship Programs include National, State, Targeted, and Career and Technical scholarships. Each scholarship program has a different application period and offers scholarships in varying amounts. The National and State Scholarship Programs have application deadlines in October. The other scholarship programs have a later application period.
- William Randolph Hearst Scholarship: This highly competitive scholarship is open to juniors and seniors. Applicants for this scholarship are required to be actively serving in an elected or appointed capacity in any one of the following student government, civic, or

educational organizations during the entire 2022-2023 academic school year: Student body president, vice president, secretary, or treasurer; class president, vice president, secretary, or treasurer; student council representative; National Honor Society officer; or student representative elected or appointed to a local, district, regional, or state-level civic, service, and/or educational organization approved by the state selection administrator.

• Publicity.ai SEO & Content Marketing Scholarship: This \$1,000 scholarship is for high school and college students interested in sales & marketing. Students applying must submit a brief essay explaining the best use of content marketing--the act of producing content to compel your audience to appreciate and share it. In 5 paragraphs or less, you should share what you saw (feel free to link to it if it's online), how it made you feel, the call-to-action, and ultimately explain why a certain marketing campaign was the best use of content marketing that you have ever seen for the purposes of achieving business goals (typically increasing revenue and profits).

September

- Make the U (HAZ LA U) Scholarship: The Haz La U program helps put Hispanic youth on the track to college by providing financial relief via educational grants totaling \$100,000.
 Selection criteria includes: Academic excellence, dedication to community service, and demonstration of leadership in one's community.
- Michigan Tech University-Leading Scholar Award: This full tuition scholarship program is
 open to first-year students enrolling in their first fall semester at Michigan Technological
 University. As a part of the selection process, students will submit an essay and
 teacher/mentor recommendation. Approximately 40 finalists will be invited to campus in
 December where they will participate in group processing activities, faculty evaluations,
 and a writing exercise.
- AES Engineering Scholarship: This \$500 scholarship will be awarded on the basis of character, as determined by an evaluation of the essays that are submitted. Scholarships are intended for our future leaders across a wide spectrum of fields of study. You are not required to be taking Engineering courses to be eligible.
- Washington University in St. Louis Danforth Scholars Program: This program honors students with a passion for helping others. They are looking for students who have demonstrated leadership in service and a strong commitment to community. Danforth Scholars are also known for their academic excellence, personal integrity, and high ideals. Danforth Scholars may receive full or partial tuition scholarships.
- John F. Kennedy Profile in Courage Essay Contest: This contest is open to United States high school students in grades nine through twelve. Students will describe and analyze an act of political courage by a U.S. elected official who served during or after 1917, the year John F. Kennedy was born. First-place winner receives \$10,000. Second-place winner receives \$3,000. Five finalists receive \$1,000 each. Eight semifinalists receive \$100 each. Visit the website for complete guidelines.

- The Great Scholarship Program: Great Clips provides over \$100,000 in scholarships and cosmetology tools to high school students interested in pursuing a cosmetology career and to cosmetology students each year. The scholarship award and professional tools are valued between \$250 \$1,500.
- Consumers Cooperative Association Scholarship: Applicant and/or parent/guardian
 must be a member of Consumers Cooperative Credit Union for a minimum of one year.
 Applicants will be evaluated on academic performance, financial need and leadership
 abilities. 15 scholarships for \$2,000 each will be awarded.
- Sustainable Development Challenge for High School Students: Students will submit a 300-500 word statement that describes an innovative approach or idea they have for addressing one of the UN Sustainable Development Goals. High school sophomores, juniors, and seniors are eligible to participate. Ten Finalists will be selected. 1st Place Winner: \$2,500 cash prize, plus a \$10,000 scholarship to attend Seton Hall University (\$2,500 annually).
- Asian & Pacific Islander American Scholarship Fund (APIASF): The Asian and Pacific
 Islander American Scholarship Fund offers scholarship opportunities for Asian American
 and Pacific Islander students with financial need to increase their access to higher
 education and resources that cultivate their academic, personal, and professional
 success.
- Free Speech Essay Contest: This scholarship is for juniors and seniors in high school.
 Students will write an essay and explain why free speech is so important to higher education, and why censorship undermines the ideals of liberal education and a free society.
- Illinois DAR General Scholarship: Seven scholarships for \$1,000 each will be offered to U.S. citizens who will be attending a 2 or 4 year college or university in Illinois. The scholarship is primarily based on need. All required forms must be submitted to the local DAR Chapter for preliminary judging.
- General Henry Dearborn American History Scholarship: This scholarship is for a student who is planning to major in American History. It must be submitted to the North Shore Chapter of DAR.
- Aim North Development Corporation Scholarship: Aim North Development Corporation, along with the Lake County Housing Authority, is offering an Academic and Enrichment Scholarship program. Scholarships are available to students who have parents in the Family Self-Sufficiency program. Any student seeking to join an extracurricular activity or a high school senior entering college may apply. Students must maintain a "C" average. The award amount for Enrichment is \$500. The Academic award is up to \$1,000. The award amount may vary from year to year, depending on the availability of funds. This is an ongoing scholarship, so there is no deadline to apply.
- <u>Greenhouse Scholars Scholarship:</u> Greenhouse Scholars' vision is to create a community of leaders who will evolve the communities of the world. We work with the next generation

of leaders and change agents, and together change the trajectory of their families, their communities, and broader global communities.

OUR PROGRAM, ELIGIBILITY, AND APPLICATION PROCESS: We are not a typical scholarship. Our unique, Whole Person approach provides personal and professional support, in addition to financial subsidies, during all 4 years of college. Applicants must have an unweighted GPA of at least 3.5 and demonstrate financial need (annual household income no greater than \$70,000).

FINANCIAL SUPPORT: Scholars may apply for two forms of financial support each year; a four-year, renewable scholarship award of up to \$5,000 per year and 'flex funding' grants of up to \$2,000 per award. Flex Funding grants support a wide range of projects and experiences related to the vision and values of Greenhouse Scholars.

- Eugene McDermott Scholars Program: This scholarship is for very high achieving students who will be attending the University of Texas at Dallas. The following will be considered in selecting recipients: 1. Long records of leadership in school and community volunteerism 2. Broad and eclectic interests in science, literature, and the arts 3. Social skills to interact easily with adults as well as peers. FINANCIAL COMPONENTS: Full UT Dallas tuition and fees, \$1,400 monthly stipends, year-round (Freshmen receive \$400 monthly since room & board are covered), \$1,000 yearly textbook stipend, \$12,000 fund for scholar-designed study abroad, \$3,000 fund for individualized professional development. . . and more! Applicants must first apply to UT Dallas.
- Voice of Democracy: This scholarship is open to students in grades 9-12. Students compete for this scholarship by writing and recording an audio essay on an annual patriotic theme. This year's theme is: Why My Vote Matters. Prizes and scholarships can be awarded at the Post, District, State and National level.
- Skilled Labor Shortage Scholarship: HomeAdvisor will award \$2,500 to six students who
 can devise a creative solution to America's skilled labor crisis. Eligible students must plan
 to attend a local community college, technical institute, or university during the 2020-2021
 academic year to study anything from construction management, plumbing or carpentry to
 landscape architecture or interior design.
- Boston University Trustee Scholarship: Trustee Scholars rank at the top of their classes
 and demonstrate exceptional leadership in their schools and communities. Scholarship
 recipients are selected by a faculty committee from a competitive pool of applicants after
 rigorous review. The Trustee Scholarship covers full undergraduate tuition plus orientation
 and mandatory undergraduate student fees for four years.

October

Comcast Leaders and Achievers Scholarship Program: Comcast NBCUniversal
anticipates awarding over 800 scholarships for the 2020-2021 school year. This scholarship
program recognizes high school seniors for their community service, academic
performance, and leadership skills. Applicants must plan to enroll in full-time
undergraduate study at an accredited two or four year college or university
or vocational/technical college. They must also demonstrate financial need. In addition to

the \$2,500 scholarship awards, a select number of awardees will be chosen as recipients of a Founder's Award. These scholarship winners will receive awards that are greater than \$2,500.

- STOKES Educational Scholarship Program: The Stokes Educational Scholarship Program is open to high school seniors, particularly minority students who are planning to major in computer science or computer/electrical engineering. You will attend college full-time, receive up to \$30,000 per year for tuition and mandatory fees, and work during the summers at NSA in areas that are related to your course of study.
- Universal Technical Institute & Penski Scholarship Competition: High school seniors
 can participate in a scholarship competition that covers basic knowledge in math, English,
 history, geography, ethics, and technical knowledge related to auto, diesel, NASCAR,
 collision repair, motorcycle and marine industries. The test will be held at the UTI-Lisle
 campus. Individual awards will be worth up to \$2,500 for use at UTI. An open house will be
 held on the same day.
- Illinois Chemical Education Foundation: Several \$2,000 scholarships will be awarded to top high school senior science students planning on a career in science. They must attend a college/university in Illinois.
- Golden Apple Scholars of Illinois: The Golden Apple Scholars of Illinois is a scholarship program that identifies talented high school seniors, as well as first and second-year college students who have the promise and drive to be excellent teachers in high-need schools. We prepare them for immediate and lasting success in the most challenging teaching environments. Scholars Receive: Tuition support of up to \$23,000, paid Summer Institutes that include courses and extensive classroom/work experience, academic support, job placement assistance, and ongoing mentoring from award-winning teachers throughout college and during the early years of teaching.
- The Norm Brodsky Business Concept Competition: High school seniors, juniors and sophomores may apply. Students will write a 400 word description of a business concept. Finalists will present to a panel of judges. Top prize for seniors: 4-year, full-tuition scholarship to Rider University and plaque. Top prize for sophomores and juniors: \$750, plaque and automatic entrance to the finals when they are a senior. All travel costs will be covered for finalists in the Senior Division.

November

- Kids' Chance Inc. of Illinois: To be eligible for a scholarship grant, applicants must have a parent who has been killed or seriously injured as a result of a work related accident that meets the criteria of the Illinois Workers Compensation Act and that has resulted in demonstrated financial need. Student applicant and/or deceased/injured worker are not required to be a legal resident of Illinois.
- Scholarships for College-Bound Chicagoland Powered by the Law Office of Nicholas W. Richardson, P.C.: These scholarships are open to high school seniors residing in Cook, DuPage, Kane, Lake, or McHenry counties. Four \$250 scholarships will be awarded to

promising seniors for intellectual strength, independent thinking, and exceptional achievement.

- American Fire Sprinkler Association Scholarship: AFSA wants to educate the public atlarge about the life-saving properties of automatic fire sprinklers. This scholarship is open to High School Seniors who want to pursue a college degree or trade school education. Enter for the chance to win 1 of 10 \$2,000 College Scholarships. Winners are randomly selected by computer-generated drawing at the conclusion of the contest period.
- Lake County Federation of Teachers Scholarship: This scholarship is for a student who will be attending a 2 or 4 year college/university in ILLINOIS. The student must have attended a Lake County, Illinois public high school.
- Fueling the Minds of the Future Scholarship: This program is dedicated to giving back to the communities in which Graham Enterprise, Inc and Graham C-Stores Company operate. The program provides support to youths in the Chicagoland area by offering \$2,000 scholarships to entering college freshmen. - The Dream. Us National Scholarship: This scholarship is for DREAMers with significant, unmet financial need. While we consider your GPA and test scores, we place great emphasis on your demonstrated ability to overcome the barriers and challenges that DREAMers face each and every day. If you do not have DACA or TPS, you can still apply for our scholarship if you meet our immigration eligibility criteria (which mirror the DACA eligibility criteria). You will need to certify this as a part of the application.
- American Chemical Society Scholars: African American, Native American, and
 Hispanic/Latino students planning to pursue full-time study in a chemically-related field
 with outstanding academic records and a desire to pursue a career in the chemical
 sciences can apply for an ACS Scholars Award. Students must demonstrate financial need
 according to the Free Application for Federal Student Aid form (FAFSA) and the Student Aid
 Report (SAR) form. This \$2,500 award is renewable.
- American Legion High School Oratorical Contest: This contest exists to develop deeper knowledge and appreciation for the U.S. Constitution among high school students. Since 1938, the program has presented participants with an academic speaking challenge that

teaches important leadership qualities, the history of our nation's laws, the ability to think and speak clearly, and an understanding of the duties, responsibilities, rights and privileges of American citizenship. Numerous scholarships are awarded. Deadlines vary.

- Fred S. Bailey Scholarship-for students attending U of IL-Urbana/Champaign: The Bailey Undergraduate awards are \$3000 awards (\$1500/semester) given each year to undergraduate students at the University of Illinois who have demonstrated positive impact and commitment as a result of service, community involvement, leadership, and action.
- National Society Daughters of the American Revolution: The NSDAR awards multiple scholarships to students showing dedication to the pursuit of degrees in diverse disciplines including history, law, nursing, and education. Scholarship amounts vary.
- National Commission for Cooperative Education Scholarship: The purpose of this
 scholarship is to assist students who want to attend an institution which advances
 cooperative and work integrated education. Students must attend one of the WACE Partner
 Institutions (see website for list of schools). Applicants will write an essay of no more than
 200 words describing why they have chosen to pursue a college cooperative education
 program. Although it depends on the institution, most of the scholarships are renewable.
 Application deadlines vary.
- Our Opportunities-Chicago Public School Scholarships: Chicago Public Schools
 encourages all academically eligible students to apply for strategic scholarships that are
 offered through our Academic Works tool to help with college costs. Scholarship
 applications will require closer review for actual eligibility; thoroughly review/read
 scholarship criteria for best contact, content and instructions on applying. *MULTIPLE
 SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES ON THIS SITE*
- AFA (Alzheimer's Foundation of America) Teen Scholarship Essay Contest: Each year,
 AFA holds a scholarship essay contest which asks students to describe how Alzheimer's
 disease changed or impacted their lives. All high school seniors who are US citizens or
 permanent residents and plan to enter a four year college/university in 2020 are invited to
 take part in the contest. Scholarship awards range between \$500 and \$5,000.
- Paramount Tall Club of Chicago Scholarship: The Paramount Tall Club of Chicago (PTC) through the Paramount Foundation awards one \$750 scholarship to a graduating high school senior who lives in the Chicagoland area and meets the height requirements of the club, 5' 10" for females and 6' 2" for males. The PTC scholarship is to be used toward tuition expenses and will be paid directly to the college or university that the recipient will attend.
- University of Dayton ROTC Scholarship: Several types of full-tuition scholarships are
 offered. The Army ROTC curriculum focuses on leadership development. They are looking
 for quality students in a scholar, athlete and leader category and a propensity to serve their
 country in the Armed Forces.
- Jackie Robinson Foundation Scholarship: Through its Mentoring and Leadership
 Development Program, the Jackie Robinson Foundation provides scholarships of up to
 \$30,000 over four years to minority high school students showing leadership potential and

demonstrating financial need to attend an accredited 4-year college or university of their choice.

- <u>Union Plus Scholarship Program</u>: Dependent children of current or retired members of participating unions may apply for this scholarship. Applicants are evaluated according to academic ability, social awareness, financial need, and appreciation of labor. A GPA of 3.0 or higher is recommended. The awards range from \$500 to \$4,000.
- Point Foundation Scholarship: The individual applying for this scholarship must be "out" as a person who identifies as a member of the LGBTQ community. Point Foundation considers many factors when assessing scholarship applicants, including: 1. A proven track record of leadership and community involvement 2. Strong academic achievement 3. Working for the betterment of the LGBTQ community 4. Financial need. Point Scholarships are awarded on a "last provider" basis, meaning that Point fills in the gaps and provides funds not provided by other scholarships, grants, loans, work/study programs, etc.
- Mensa Education and Research Foundation Scholarship: Applicants must submit an
 application and essay (550 words or less) explaining his or her career, academic and/or
 vocational goals. The essays are judged on content and also grammar, organization and
 craftsmanship. Award amounts vary.
- Ron Brown Scholarship: This scholarship honors the legacy of Ronald H. Brown through a selective scholarship program that advances higher education for community-minded and intellectually gifted African Americans. RBSP competitively awards Ron Brown Scholars a \$40,000 scholarship (\$10,000/year for four years) to the most talented and economically-challenged high school seniors who demonstrate a keen interest in public service, community engagement, business entrepreneurship and global citizenship the four pillars of the late Ronald H. Brown's mission to uplift people of all races, cultures and ethnicities, especially our disadvantaged youth.
- Children of Veterans Tuition Waiver: This is a four-year in-state tuition waiver at the University of Illinois. The recipient may use his/her Children of Veterans Tuition Waiver at any of the University of Illinois campuses (Urbana-Champaign, Chicago, Health Sciences Center, or Springfield).
- Washington Crossing Foundation Scholarship: Students are invited to write a one page
 essay stating why he or she plans a career in government service including any inspiration
 to be derived from the leadership of George Washington in his famous crossing of the
 Delaware.
- Wisconsin Alumni Association Chicago Scholarship Trust: The Chicago Chapter currently supports 20 students at University of Wisconsin-Madison with \$5,000 and \$6,000 grants per year. Chicagoland students who have been admitted to the UW, are in the 95th percentile of their high school graduating class or have a 28 or better on the ACT, and have a strong history of leadership in extracurricular activities are eligible.
- <u>The Geisinger Scholarship Program at University of Michigan</u>: This scholarship is for non-Michigan residents. Recipients must be enrolled full-time at the University of Michigan

- and be pursuing an undergraduate degree program in engineering. The scholarship program will provide \$20,000 in annual support to students. Students must maintain a 3.0 GPA.
- National Lutheran Fraternity Scholarships: Beta Sigma Psi is a fraternity dedicated to serving the Lutheran Community. Scholarships are offered at various universities. Young men who wish to apply are under no obligation to join Beta Sigma Psi or be related to a member for consideration. Applicants may apply for multiple awards if they are still deciding which school they plan to attend. Application deadlines vary.
- Illinois AMVETS Scholarships: A variety of scholarships are available to veterans and their families. Go to their website for details.
- Americanism Essay Contest: The purpose of this essay contest is to aid the schools of Illinois in the teaching of AMERICANISM and GOOD CITIZENSHIP. Students must write an essay on: "What are my responsibilities as a U.S. Citizen?" Essays must be submitted to a local American Legion Post, American Legion Auxiliary Unit or Sons of The American Legion Squadron.
- General and Kelly Tanabe Scholarship: This scholarship is a merit-based program that helps students fulfill their dreams of a higher education. The scholarship is named for Gen and Kelly Tanabe, best-selling authors on education, whose generous donations fund this program. The selection of the winner is made by an independent panel of judges and is based primarily on the quality of the submitted personal statement.
- Make College Happen Challenge: Through Sallie Mae you can register for Scholarship Search which is a free way to get access to more than 5 million college scholarships worth up to \$24 billion. Register in November and be entered to win \$5,000 for college.
- AXA Achievement Scholarship: This scholarship offers college scholarships of \$2,500, \$10,000 and \$25,000 to high school seniors who have demonstrated outstanding achievement in their activities in school, the community or the workplace. Scholarship winners are known as AXA Achievers. They are ethnically and economically diverse, but they share these qualities: ambition and drive; determination to set and reach goals; respect for self, family and community; ability to succeed in college.
- Burger King Scholars Program: Scholarship grants range from \$1,000 to \$50,000 and are
 intended to help students offset the cost of attending college or post-secondary
 vocational/technical school. Recipients are selected based on their grade point average
 (GPA), work experience, extracurricular activities and community service.
- Science Ambassador Scholarship: This full-tuition scholarship is for a woman seeking an undergraduate degree in science, engineering, or math. The ideal candidate will be an ambassador for her field. She will be someone who is passionate about discovery and who shares her excitement with others. To apply, submit a three minute video of yourself explaining a topic in science you are passionate about.
- Bowling Green State University Presidential Scholars Award: This scholarship is for high achieving students planning to attend BGSU. Up to 30 scholarships will be awarded. A

- complete application must be submitted to BGSU and to the Honors College by December 3. Applications will be reviewed after the deadline and selected students will be invited to interview on campus.
- Stephen J. Brady Stop Hunger Scholarship: Every year Sodexo Stop Hunger Foundation recognizes up to five students with sustained and innovative hunger-fighting ideas as Stephen J. Brady Stop Hunger Scholars. National scholarship winners receive a \$5,000 scholarship for their education and a \$5,000 grant for their hunger-related charity of choice. The Sodexo Stop Hunger Foundation will also recognize up to 20 Stop Hunger regional honorees with a \$1,000 donation for their preferred hunger-relief charity.
- **GE-Reagan Foundation Scholarship Program:** This program honors the legacy and character of our nation's 40th President by rewarding college-bound students who demonstrate exemplary leadership, drive, integrity, and citizenship with financial assistance to pursue higher education. Through the generous support of GE, this national program annually awards \$10,000 renewable scholarships to numerous students.

December

- Caring Women's Connection Scholarship & Service Award: This \$3,000 scholarship is
 for graduating high school seniors attending an accredited college, university, or vocational
 school in fall 2020 to obtain a 2 to 4 year degree. Eligibility requirements: Be a Lake County
 resident. Have a minimum overall academic GPA of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) and a minimum GPA
 of 3.0 in Math, English and Science. Must have at least 50 hours of verifiable volunteer
 hours during your high school career. Must be willing to volunteer for 10 hours of service
 time in a community of your choice.
- MacLean-Fogg Scholarship: This scholarship is one of the most competitive, generous scholarships specifically for an MHS student who will be attending a 4-year college or university. The scholarship is \$3,000 per year for each of the four years of undergraduate study, to a maximum of \$12,000. The MacLean-Fogg Scholarship includes the opportunity of employment during the recipient's vacation periods. Applicants should demonstrate proficiency in mathematics and/or the sciences, coupled with skills of creativity, leadership, and an entrepreneurial spirit. This application requires thoughtful answers and letters of recommendation. It is not an application you should rush through.
- Chicago North Shore Alumnae Panhellenic Association Scholarship: The Chicago North Shore Alumnae Panhellenic Association (CNSAPA) is pleased to award multiple scholarships for \$1,000 each to qualified graduating high school women residing in the Chicago North Shore area.
